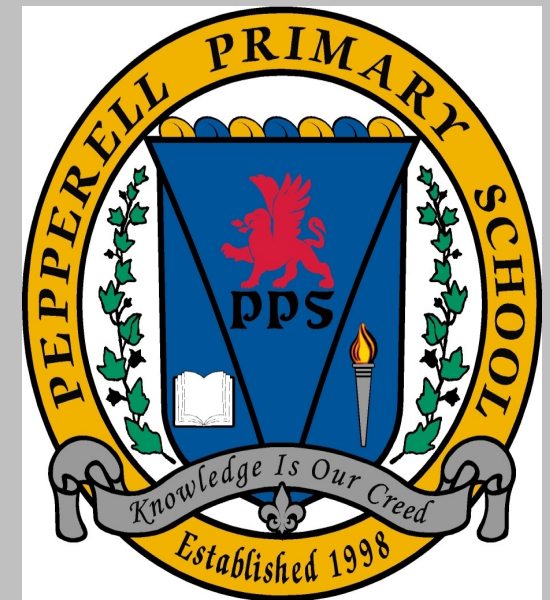

In The Pepperell Primary School Classroom

Teachers will work with students and their families to support students' success in all academic areas. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- Assign students classwork and homework which is aligned to the standards and support Destination Graduation for every child.
- Create and model the expectation of correct penmanship.
- Provide parents with conference opportunities and Title 1 events to assist students with mastery of state standards.
- Maintain communication with parents through student agendas and provide newsletters that feature resources that families can use to reinforce current classroom instruction.
- Provide every student with opportunities for daily independent/ oral reading and mathematic fluency.

Pepperell Primary Students

Pepperell Primary School students shared ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach their full potential. The following ideas assist in making connections between learning at home and school:

- Complete classwork and homework assignments. For literacy improvement and growth towards Destination Graduation for every child.
- Maintain correct penmanship in all areas of the curriculum.
- Use strategies provided by the teacher to support improvement in the areas of reading and math.
- Take home agenda and classroom newsletters/memos to inform my parents about what I am learning in school.
- Read at home daily to increase my Lexile level and strengthen vocabulary development, reading, comprehension, content knowledge and sight word fluency.

At Home

Pepperell Primary School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support student success in reading and math.

- Check homework nightly for understanding of concepts in reading and math, completion, and neatness.
- Attend scheduled conferences and Title 1 events that focus on curriculum, academic strategies, and my child's academic growth.
- Utilize available resources listed in newsletters and on school website links.
- Review my child's agenda, stay informed about school events, maintain the learning expectations set for my child and communicate with my child's school frequently.
- Read with/to my child daily to support my child's vocabulary, reading, comprehension development, and sight word fluency.
